

# Why would I go to an education conference when I might not even have my teaching job in the fall?

This is no ordinary education conference. It examines what teachers, union members and community activists did in the 1930s when confronted with a situation similar to ours today: an economic crisis with ripple effects into public education, and a political opening for change. Each workshop looks at an aspect of education and organizing, measures efforts in the 30s with what was needed, judges their successes and failures, and compares with today. In keeping with the conference theme, this isn't all talk and no action. It includes a public rally to support pink-slipped teachers, and the conference will conclude with action plans to involve the community more deeply in defense of school jobs and public education programs.
